Biodiesel Fuel Quality Seminars This Fall

Virginia Clean Cities and the Hampton Roads Clean Cities Coalition won a competitive grant award from the National Biodiesel Foundation to host biodiesel fuel quality seminars to advance education on biodiesel quality issues.

The target audience for these events includes petroleum marketers, fleet managers, federal and state enforcement professionals, and others.

The agenda includes the following topics:

Biodiesel Preparedness: This session covers adding biodiesel to your product line, preparing for the transition to biodiesel, fuel sampling techniques, and how to prepare customers for a biodiesel transition.



Filters can clog if glycerin levels are too high in the biodiesel used to blend.

Fuel Management and Housekeeping: This session covers basic properties and blending considerations for biodiesel, blending techniques, cold weather considerations, storing biodiesel blends, fuel quality assurance, biodiesel tax credit and funding opportunities.

ASTM & Quality Control: It's

not biodiesel unless it meets the ASTM standard. This session explores what the standard means, why it is vitally important to the future of biodiesel, what it means to producers, distributors and users and how quality control programs ensure ASTM standards are met.

Defense Supply Center Richmond now Offers E85

The Defense Supply Center Richmond recently opened an E85 dispenser. The Army Air Force Exchange Service (AAFES) is the operator of the E85 dispenser, which is at the Post Exchange at DSCR. Voyager, credit cards and cash are all acceptable means of payment for E85. The pump is 24/7 accessible, but cash is accepted only from 0900 to 1330 and 1430 to 1700 Monday through Friday. Access to the station is permitted to those with security clearance

to get onto DSCR premises (employees, contractors, guests, Federal, State and local government employees, Military and their dependents). DSCR's core mission is to supply products with a direct application to aviation. These items include a mix of military-unique items supporting over 1,300 major weapons systems and other items readily available in the commercial market.

October Hydrogen Teacher Training Workshop at Nauticus

The one-day teacher training workshops are designed to support Virginia Science Standards of Learning and provide educators with tools to return to their classrooms to integrate hydrogen into their curriculum. Participating schools receive the H2 Educate curriculum and hands-on kits created by the National Energy Education Development (NEED) Project.

Virginia's Vision and Strategy for the Hydrogen Economy (on our

website!) developed by the Virginia Hydrogen Economy Roundtable recommends actions to foster the development of a hydrogen economy in Virginia. Five actions are recommended as priorities to help focus Virginia's continuing efforts to build a hydrogen economy and educating Virginia's workforce was one of the recommendations.

The first workshop was held in Richmond, while the second

will be hosted by Nauticus in Norfolk on October 4, 2007 from 8 am to 3 pm.

Senator Frank Wagner, Senator Nick Rerras, Delegate John Welch, and Councilman Randy Wright are invited to speak at the press event. A GM Hydrogen Fuel Cell vehicle will be available for a ride and drive.

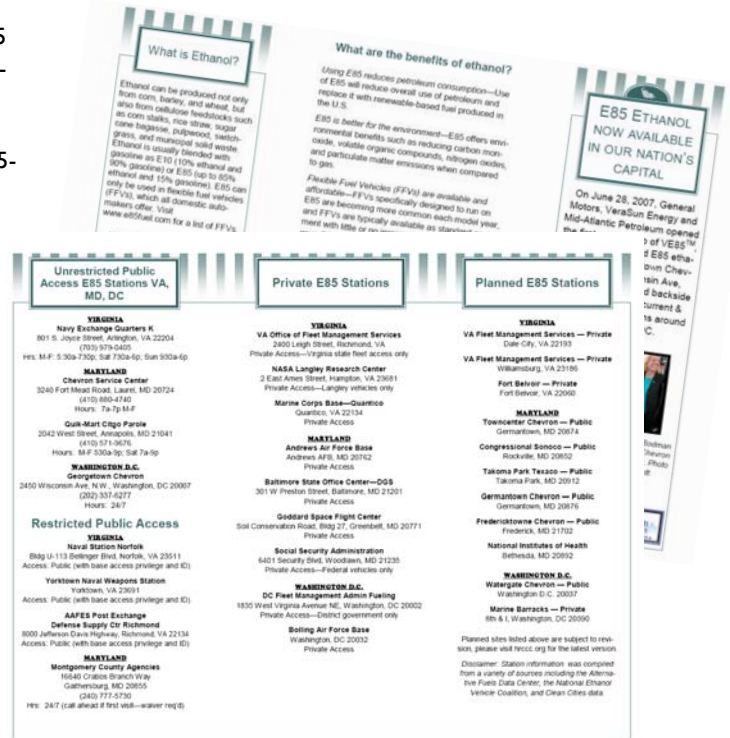


National Airport's CNG Station on Clark St.

E85 Infrastructure Project Update — Station Locator Brochure Available

The objective of the VA-MD-DC E85 Infrastructure Project is to make E85 publicly available at up to 12 locations in Virginia, Maryland and DC by providing grant funds to station owners to help defray the cost of conversion.

After the infrastructure is available, it's important to educate drivers of E85-capable Flex Fuel Vehicles (FFVs) on where they can purchase E85 so that new locations will be patronized. A brochure was developed with a customizable cover so it can target different audiences. The brochure includes unrestricted public access, restricted public access, private and planned E85 stations, and explains the benefits of using the alternative fuel and makes it clear that E85 can only be used in E85-capable FFVs. The first version will be distributed to GM dealers near the new Georgetown Chevron in DC and GSA fleet managers so they can be placed in FFVs parked at federal facilities near the new DC pump. A different version has been developed for the Virginia fleet of FFFVs. The brochure will be posted on our site: www.hrccc.org.
